Call for Submissions of Student Compositions

It's that time of year when we begin looking forward to the annual *Compose Yourself! Workshop* at Hoff-Barthelson! This is a special opportunity for our students to share their compositions with an audience and then to receive feedback from a panel of visiting professional composers.

When? The *Compose Yourself! Workshop will be held on* Saturday, March 2, 2024, from 1:00-5:00 pm, in the Joan Behrens Bergman Auditorium.

- 1:00-4:00 pm Students receive feedback about their compositions from our esteemed guest composers.
- 4:00-5:00 pm Each guest composer will give a short presentation about their music.

Who is eligible to submit compositions for consideration? Any HBMS student who composes her/his own music is eligible. One need not be formally enrolled in composition lessons or classes to be considered.

When and how can students submit their compositions for consideration?

- Send submissions directly to Dr. Derek Cooper, dcooper@hbms.org.
- All submissions must be accompanied by a COMPLETED submission form (see below).
- Submissions are due by February 15, 2024.
- Students may submit works that are in-progress.

Then what? Student submissions will be reviewed by HBMS composition faculty. Students whose compositions are approved will be invited to participate in the *Compose Yourself! Workshop* on March 2, 2024. Following the workshop, students may be invited to share their compositions on the *Compose Yourself! Recital* (part of the Music of Our Time Festival) on May 18, 2024, at 5:30 pm. These students will be given the opportunity to revise their selected compositions before this concert to incorporate what they learned during the workshop.

Guest Composers: We are excited to once again partner with <u>Copland House</u> to feature one of their Composers-in-Residence, Dr. Alyssa Weinberg, along with my former composition teacher, Dr. Reiko Füting.

Dr. Reiko Füting joined the theory faculty at the Manhattan School of Music in 2000. Five years later, he became a member of the composition faculty and was appointed Chair of the Theory Department. In 2020, he was also appointed Chair of the Composition Department and is currently serving as Dean of Academic Core and Head of Composition. As a composer, Reiko has received numerous prizes, awards,

scholarships, grants, and commissions. His opera on the life of the mystic nun Mechthild von Magdeburg was premiered at the reopening of the concert hall in Magdeburg, Germany in 2022. Reiko is Composer-in-Residence at the Gesellschaftshaus Magdeburg during the 2023/2024 season. Read more at

Dr. Alyssa Weinberg uses color, texture, and gesture to channel big emotions, creating music that is "quite literally stunning" (Chicago Tribune). She is fascinated with perception and loves to play with form, subverting expectations to create surreal scenarios, often in dreamy, multidisciplinary productions. Weinberg's 2023/24 season features the world premiere of her monodrama *ISOLA*, a prismatic meditation on time, mental health, and isolation, written in collaboration with poet J.
