

During this lively and interactive discussion, composer Nilo Alcala and Hoff-Barthelson Music School Music of Our Time Festival director Peter Seidenberg, will explore the impetus of Alcala's new work *"To the Others,"* based upon Lola Ridge's poem of the same title and commissioned by HBMS.

Discussion topics include the work's development and preparations for its world premiere by select HBMS students at 7:00 pm on Sunday evening, May 21st at the Music of our Time Festival's Large Ensemble Concert at Community Unitarian Universalist Congregation, 468 Rosedale Avenue, White Plains, NY.

Nilo is carving a legacy for Philippine Arts internationally. A trailblazing artist, he is the first Philippine-born composer to receive the Copland House Residency Award, as well as to be commissioned by Grammy-winner Los Angeles Master Chorale.

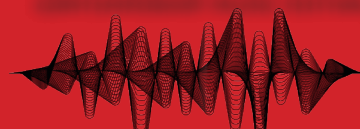
