

AUDITIONS. HBMS Festival Orchestra for oboe, bassoon, horn, trumpet, percussion and strings

Hoff-Barthelson Music School's Festival Orchestra is a full symphonic orchestra for high school students at the highest level of technical ability and musical artistry. Under the direction of Jun Nakabayashi, the Festival Orchestra performs three concerts annually; two are with guest artists of international stature. The orchestra meets on Tuesday evenings from 7:15 - 9:30 pm. Members participate in sectional coachings with musicians from the New York Philharmonic each spring. Festival Orchestra auditions are open to all high school students, whether studying at HBMS or elsewhere. Students not yet in high school but who demonstrate exceptional ability and maturity may also audition.

Tuition, Merit Scholarships, and Financial Aid: Annual tuition is \$1,100 and prorated for mid-year enrollments. Merit scholarships are available to students who play bass, oboe, bassoon, horn or trumpet and demonstrate the highest level of technical ability and musical artistry during their audition. Applicants will be informed of scholarship award decisions when notified about their audition results.

Additionally, Hoff-Barthelson Music School welcomes need-based financial aid applications from students with household incomes of up to 450% of New York State's 2022-23 Reduced Price Lunch Eligibility levels. Learn more at https://hbms.org/register/financial-aid/.

Auditions will take place at Hoff-Barthelson Music School. Auditions include:

- 1. One or two scales chosen by the conductor (Refer to the chart below for details.)
- 2. A 2-minute presentation of a piece of your choice that demonstrates your **best technique and musicality**.
- 3. Two passages from Mendelssohn's Symphony No.1 (Refer to the chart below for the specific passages.)
