In her role as dean, she has guided the musical growth of thousands of children, youth and adult students, contributing to the development of their human and creative potential.

Alperson is an alumna of Hoff-Barthelson, where she studied piano with Mary Helton. She holds a B.A. in music from Oberlin College and a Ph.D. in arts and humanities from New York University. She took courses in eurhythmics for two years at the Dalcroze School of Music in New York City, earned a Licentiate from the Dalcroze Teachers Training Course in London and earned the Diplôme Supérieur from the L'Institut Jaques-Dalcroze in Geneva, Switzerland.
